

ORNITHOLIDAYS' TOUR TO VIETNAM

Land of the Dragon People

02 – 19 NOVEMBER 2012

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02 November 2012

The group left London on a flight to Hanoi.

03 November 2012

I met the group at Hanoi Airport and we met Mr Muoi, our local guide who had arranged the vehicle and accommodation for our trip in Vietnam. We changed some money into Vietnamese Dong and then drove for about two and a half hours to Tam Dao National Park. We stayed at a hotel in Mela where we had lunch. In the afternoon we went to “water tank trail (road)” for bird watching. It was a cloudy and foggy day.

04 November 2012

We had breakfast at 05.30 at the hotel and then we spent all day in Tam Dao. In the morning we went to the “water tank trail” but the weather was too foggy to see any birds so we then drove down to the HQ area of the park. We returned to our hotel for lunch. After lunch we went back to the “water tank trail”. The weather still bad for bird watching but we worked harder and saw some birds there.

05 November 2012

In the morning we walked to “the steps” for the antenna on small hill. The weather was still foggy and it was hard to see birds in this weather. In the afternoon we decided to return to “water tank trail” again. The weather was a little bit better but still foggy and windy. It was unfortunate that the weather was unusually poor in Tam Dao this year.

06 November 2012

In the morning we checked out of our hotel and drove to the HQ area of Tam Dao National Park where the weather was better than on the mountain. In the late morning we drove to Hanoi and had lunch at a “sen” restaurant. After a great lunch we drove for about three and a half hours to Cuc Phuong National Park. We stayed in the park accommodation.

07 November 2012

Firstly we went to the “Prehistoric cave” for bird watching. The target birds in this area were Bar-bellied Pitta, Rufous-throated Fulvetta, Limestone Leaf-Warbler and Limestone Wren-Babbler. In the afternoon we went along the road near the HQ area. We did some night bird watching near our accommodation. The weather here was not as good as expected. It was cloudy and foggy in the early morning. It was better weather when the sun appeared.

08 November 2012

We went to the “Prehistoric cave” again to look for some more birds there and then we drove to the Bong substation which was 20 kms from the HQ. There were some good birds in the Bong areas. In the afternoon we bird watched near Max Lake, close to the HQ area.

09 November 2012

In the early morning we went bird watching near the HQ area. Then we drove to Hanoi to the “sen” restaurant again. After lunch we took a flight from Hanoi to Dalat. From the airport we met a new local guide, Mr. Trine. We drove for about 40 minutes from the airport to our hotel, where we stayed for four nights.

10 November 2012

In the morning we drove to Mt. Lang Biang and spent the morning on this mountain. Mt. Lang Biang is a high mountain in the Dalat area and its peak is over 2,000 metres. We went there to look for endemic species such as Vietnamese Cutia, Collared Laughingthrush and Black-crowned Fulvetta. Unfortunately we still had bad luck with the weather. After two hours walking up hill (with bird watching along the way) the rain started to fall and continued to fall so hard that we could not do any more bird watching and so we decided to go downhill. We then drove to the Tanung valley for bird watching in the late morning until lunch time. We

had lunch in Dalat City. In the afternoon we drove back to Tanung valley and saw Grey-crowned Crocias, the rare endemic bird of Vietnam. Today was Bridget's birthday!

11 November 2012

This morning we went to Tanung valley to try to see the endemic Orange-breasted Laughingthrush and others. We took lunch in Dalat City and in the afternoon we went to Datanla waterfall and Ho Tuyen Lam for Vietnamese Greenfinch.

12 November 2012

We went back to Mt. Lang Biang again to search for endemic species. Lunch was taken in Dalat City and in the afternoon we went to Tanung valley to look for endemic species and other birds.

13 November 2012

This morning we drove south to Di Linh and then turned left onto the Phan Thiet road for bird watching. We had lunch in Di Linh and checked into our hotel. In the afternoon, we drove back to Phan Thiet road.

14 November 2012

We had a 06.00 breakfast and drove to the Phan Thiet road to spend the morning bird watching, then had lunch in Di Linh. The rain started again in the late morning and it continued with light rain all morning until nighttime. The bad weather was due to a depression that affected the entire south of Vietnam. After lunch we drove to Cat Tien National Park. The road ended at the Dong Nai River and we then took the park boat across the river to the park accommodation.

15 November 2012

We had a 06.00 breakfast and took one large vehicle and drove along the dirt road in the park. This was the best way to see the Siamese Fireback and Germain's Peacock Pheasant. There was some rain but we all continued bird watching. In the afternoon we drove to the open areas to look for the Green Peafowl and others. Unfortunately we still had bad weather all day.

16 November 2012

This morning we drove to the open areas again to find the Green Peafowl, amongst others. In the afternoon we went to the rapid trail and then returned to our accommodation to watch the nightjars.

17 November 2012

We drove to Crocodile Lake, stopping to bird watch on the way. Three of the group walked to Crocodile Lake with a packed lunch and the rest of the group had lunch at the park's canteen. At 16.00 we all met at the entrance of the Crocodile Lake trail to go bird watching together again. The weather was better today.

18 November 2012

Today was the last day of the trip. We went bird watching just near the accommodation until 08.30. Then, we packed and checked out from our accommodation and crossed the Dong Nai River to drive to Ho Chi Minh City. We stopped on the way for lunch. Today was Peter's birthday. We did our final checklist before we drove to the international airport.

19 November 2012

The group arrived back in London

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CHECKLIST OF BIRDS

Pheasants & Partridges Phasianidae

Rufous-throated Partridge

Arborophila rufogularis

We only heard the calls of this species on Mt. Lang Biang, Dalat.

Chestnut-necklaced Partridge

Arborophila charltonii

We heard the calls of this species in the forest of Cuc Phuong National Park.

Green-legged (Scaly-breasted) Partridge

Arborophila chloropus

We heard this species in Cat Tien National Park.

Red Junglefowl

Gallus gallus

We had seen male and female, in Cat Tien National Park.

Siamese Fireback

Lophura diardi

We saw five birds of both males and females feeding along the roadside in Cat Tien National Park.

Grey Peacock-Pheasant

Polyplectron bicalcaratum

We heard the calls of this species at the Bong substation in Cuc Phuong National Park.

Green Peafowl

Pavo muticus

We had a very good view of males with long tails and females at Cat Tien National Park.

Swans, Geese & Ducks Anatidae

Lesser Whistling Duck

Dendrocygna javanica

We found seven birds in the crocodile lake in Cat Tien National Park.

Grebes Podicipedidae

Little Grebe

Tachybaptus ruficollis

We saw both breeding and non-breeding dress at the lake near Tam Dao HQ areas and saw a few more birds in Ho Tuyen Lam (lake) in Dalat.

Storks Ciconidae

Woolly-necked Stork

Ciconia episcopus

A few birds were seen at Cat Tien National Park.

Hérons, Egrets & Bitterns Ardeidae

Black-crowned Night Heron

Nycticorax nycticorax

Up to 30 birds were seen along the Dong Nai River (by the boat excursion team) in Cat Tien National Park.

Striated Heron/Little Heron

Butorides striatus

We saw one bird near small stream along the Phan Thiet road and another bird was seen at the rapid of Dong Nai River at Cat Tien National Park.

Chinese Pond Heron

Ardeola bacchus

Small numbers were seen at scattered sites throughout our trip. The maximum number was up to 100 birds seen along the Dong Nai River at Cat Tien National Park.

Eastern Cattle Egret

Bubulcus (ibis) coromanda

A few birds were seen near Hanoi and some of them were feeding along the Phan Thiet road and some were seen along the road from Cat Tien National Park to Ho Chi Minh City.

Grey Heron

Ardea cinerea

Small numbers were seen at Cat Tien National Park.

Purple Heron

Ardea purpurea

Up to 10 birds were seen at Cat Tien National Park.

Intermediate Egret

Egretta intermedia

A few birds were seen near Hanoi and in Cat Tien National Park.

Little Egret

Egretta garzetta

A few birds were seen near Hanoi and on the way to Dalat. More birds were seen in Cat Tien National Park.

Osprey Pandionidae

Western Osprey

Pandion haliaetus

One bird was seen in Tanung valley and another three-four birds were seen in Cat Tien National Park.

Hawks, Kites, Eagles & Vultures Accipitridae

Jerdon's Baza

Aviceda jerdoni

One bird called in Tanung valley, Dalat but we could not see it.

Black Baza

Aviceda leuphotes

Up to five birds were seen at the forest of Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.

- Crested (Oriental) Honey-buzzard** *Pernis ptilorhynchus*
A bird was seen during the drive from Hanoi to Cuc Phuong National Park. Another bird was seen in Tanung valley and a few birds were seen in the forest of Phan Thiet road and in Cat Tien National Park.
- Black-shouldered Kite** *Elanus caeruleus*
We saw a pair flying along the road on Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.
- Crested Serpent-Eagle** *Spilornis cheela*
We enjoyed good views of this eagle at Cat Tien National Park.
- Crested Goshawk** *Accipiter trivirgatus*
We saw one bird in the forest along Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.
- Shikra** *Accipiter badius*
We saw the first bird at Tanung valley and more birds at Cat Tien National Park.
- Eurasian Sparrowhawk** *Accipiter nisus*
We saw one bird in Tanung valley, Dalat.
- Grey-faced Buzzard** *Butastur indicus*
We saw one bird in Tanung valley and more birds in Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.
- Rufous-bellied Eagle** *Lophotriorchis kienerii*
One was seen on Mt. Lang Biang and another bird was seen in Cat Tien National Park.
- Mountain Hawk -Eagle** *Nisaetus nipalensis*
We saw one bird in Cuc Phuong National Park and another bird in Cat Tien National Park.

Falcons & Caracaras Falconidae

- Collared Falconet** *Microhierax caerulescens*
We had good look at this small raptor at Cat Tien National Park.
- Pied Falconet** *Microhierax melanoleucos*
One was seen in Cuc Phuong National Park.
- Common Kestrel** *Falco tinnunculus*
One bird was seen along the road from Hanoi to Cuc Phuong National Park.
- Peregrine Falcon** *Falco peregrinus*
One bird was seen perched on antenna tower in front of Du Parc hotel in Dalat.

Rails, Gallinules & Coots Rallidae

- White-breasted Waterhen** *Amaurornis phoenicurus*
We only heard one bird called in Cat Tien National Park.

Plovers & Lapwings Charadriidae

- Red-wattled Lapwing** *Vanellus indicus*
Five birds were seen in Cat Tien National Park.
- Little Ringed Plover** *Charadrius dubius*
We saw three birds on the way from Hanoi to Cuc Phuong National Park.

Sandpipers & Allies Scolopacidae

- Pin-tailed Snipe** *Gallinago stenura*
A few birds were seen at Cat Tien National Park.
- Common Sandpiper** *Actitis hypoleucos*
A few birds were seen in the Dong Nai river areas at Cat Tien National Park.

Doves & Pigeons Columbidae

- Common (Rock) Pigeon** *Columba livia*
We found this species in towns and cities throughout.
- Red Collared-Dove** *Streptopelia tranquebarica*
Up to 100 birds were seen in Cat Tien National Park.
- Spotted Dove** *Streptopelia chinensis*.
Many birds were seen at Phan Thiet road areas and in the open areas at Cat Tien National Park.
- Barred Cuckoo-Dove** *Macropygia unchall*
Two birds were seen in Tanung valley, Dalat.
- Emerald Dove** *Chalcophaps indica*
We saw one bird at Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.
- Pink-necked Green -Pigeon** *Treron vernans*
A flock of 10 birds were seen at Cat Tien National Park.
- Ashy-headed Green-Pigeon** *Treron phayrei*
We enjoyed the telescope view of this species at Cat Tien National Park.

Thick-billed Green Pigeon*Treron curvirostra*

A flock of more than 10 birds were seen at Cuc Phuong National Park and at Phan Thiet road, Di Linh. Many of them were seen at Cat Tien National Park.

Pin-tailed Green Pigeon*Treron apicauda*

We saw this species very well at Tanung valley, Dalat.

Yellow-vented Green Pigeon*Treron seimundi*

Two birds were seen near the fig tree along Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.

Wedge-tailed Green Pigeon*Treron sphenurus*

Three birds were seen on Mt. Lang Biang, Dalat.

Green Imperial-Pigeon*Ducula aenea*

A few birds were seen at Cat Tien National Park.

Parrots & Allies Psittacidae**Vernal Hanging-Parrot***Loriculus vernalis*

Small numbers were seen at Phan Thiet road and common in Cat Tien National Park.

Grey-headed Parakeet*Psittacula finschii*

We had three birds fly overhead at Cuc Phuong National Park.

Red-breasted Parakeet*Psittacula alexandri*

We had good views of this species in Cat Tien National Park.

Cuckoos Cuculidae**Greater Coucal***Centropus sinensis*

This is a widespread species but we saw a few times on the Phan Thiet road and in Cat Tien National Park.

Lesser Coucal*Centropus bengalensis*

We had great view of one bird in the open grassland of Cat Tien National Park.

Green-billed Malkoha*Phaenicophaeus tristis*

Our first bird of this species was seen in Cuc Phuong National Park and many more birds were seen were seen in the forest of Phan Thiet road and in the forest of Cat Tien National Park.

Banded Bay Cuckoo*Cacomantis sonneratii*

We had great views of adult bird in Tanung valley, Dalat.

Fork-tailed Drongo-Cuckoo*Surniculus dicruroides*

We saw the first bird in the forest of Phan Thiet road and saw more birds in Cat Tien National Park.

Typical Owls Strigidae**Mountain Scops-Owl***Otus spilocephalus*

We only heard the calls of this owl in Cuc Phuong National Park.

Collared Scops-Owl*Otus lettia*

Some of us enjoyed great views of one at Cuc Phuong National Park.

Collared Owlet*Glaucidium brodiei*

We had incredible close scope views of one individual located by its diurnal call at Tam Dao National Park and saw another bird at Mt. Lang Biang National Park.

Asian Barred Owlet*Glaucidium cuculoides*

We saw this species at Cat Tien National Park.

Brown Boobook (Hawk-Owl)*Ninox scutulata*

We only heard the calls of this owl in Cat Tien National Park.

Nightjars & Allies Caprimulgidae**Great Eared Nightjar***Eurostopodus macrotis*

We had great views of up to 10 birds feeding in evening around the accommodation at Cat Tien National Park.

Large-tailed Nightjar*Caprimulgus macrurus*

We saw this bird at the same place where we saw the Great Eared Nightjar but these nightjars were smaller and fed lower than the Great Eared Nightjar.

Swifts Apodidae**Germain's Swiftlet***Aerodramus germani*

We saw a few birds every day at Cat Tien National Park.

Brown-backed Needletail*Hirundapus giganteus*

We saw two birds in the forrest of Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.

Asian Palm-Swift*Cypsiurus balasiensis*

We saw this swift at Cuc Phuong and at Cat Tien National Parks.

House Swift*Apus nipalensis*

Up to 100 birds were seen in Dalat City and nearby areas of Dalat.

Trogons Trogonidae

Orange-breasted Trogon

Harpactes oreskios

We had wonderful views of a male in Cat Tien National Park.

Red-headed Trogon

Harpactes erythrocephalus

We saw one bird in Cuc Phuong National Park.

Rollers Coraciidae

Indian Roller

Coracias benghalensis

Few birds were seen in the open areas of Cat Tien National Park.

Dollarbird

Eurystomus orientalis

We first saw this species at Tanung valley and saw them again in Cat Tien National Park.

Kingfishers Alcedinidae

Banded Kingfisher

Lacedo pulchella

We had great views of both male and female in Cat Tien National Park.

Stork-billed Kingfisher

Pelargopsis capensis

Two birds were seen in Dong Nai River, Cat Tien National Park.

White-throated Kingfisher

Halcyon smyrnensis

We enjoyed seeing this kingfisher at Tam Dao National Park, Tanung valley, Phan Thiet road and at Cat Tien National Park.

Black-capped Kingfisher

Halcyon pileata

We saw two birds in Dong Nia River, Cat Tien National Park.

Common Kingfisher

Alcedo atthis

Small numbers were seen at scattered sites including Tam Dao, Cuc Phuong and Cat Tien National Parks.

Pied Kingfisher

Ceryle rudis

Up to 30 birds were seen from the private boat trip along Dong Nai River, Cat Tien National Park.

Bee-eaters Meropidae

Blue-bearded Bee-eater

Nyctyornis athertoni

We saw this species very well in Tanung valley and saw more birds in Cat Tien National Park.

Blue-tailed Bee-eater

Merops philippinus

A few birds were seen in the open areas of Cat Tien National Park.

Chestnut-headed Bee-eater

Merops leschenaulti

Small numbers were seen along the forest at Phan Thiet road and many of them were seen at Cat Tien National Park.

Hornbills Bucerotidae

Oriental Pied-Hornbill

Anthracoceros albirostris

Small numbers were seen in Cat Tien National Park.

Great Hornbill

Buceros bicornis

Some of us saw this impressive bird in Cat Tien National Park.

Barbets Capitonidae

Red-vented Barbet

Megalaima lagrandieri

We heard the calls of this barbet at many places and finally we had a great view at a fig tree at Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.

Lineated Barbet

Megalaima lineata

We had scope views of a few birds in Cat Tien National Park.

Green-eared Barbet

Megalaima faiostriata

We had wonderful scope views of this bird in Cuc Phuong and also in Cat Tien National Parks.

Golden-throated Barbet

Megalaima franklinii

We only heard the calls of this barbet on Mt. Lang Biang, Dalat.

Annam Barbet (Black-browed Barbet)

Megalaima annamensis

We had great scope views of several birds in forest of Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.

Blue-eared Barbet

Megalaima australis

We saw a few birds in Cat Tien National Park and only heard the calls in other places.

Coppersmith Barbet

Megalaima haemacephala

We only heard the calls of this barbet at Cat Tien National Park.

Woodpeckers Picidae

Speckled Piculet

Picumnus innominatus

We saw this small woodpecker on Mt. Lang Biang of Dalat and another bird was seen in the forest of Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.

White-browed Piculet

Sasia ochracea

We had good views of this tiny woodpecker in Cat Tien National Park.

Grey-capped Pygmy Woodpecker*Dendrocopos canicapillus*

We saw the first one in Cuc Phuong National Park and another bird in the forest of Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.

White-bellied Woodpecker*Dryocopus javensis*

We only heard the calls of this woodpecker in Cat Tien National Park.

Greater Yellownape*Chrysophlegma flavinucha*

One bird was seen at Cuc Phuong National Park.

Lesser Yellownape*Picus chlorolophus*

We only heard the calls of this species in Cat Tien National Park.

Laced Woodpecker*Picus vittatus*

We had great views of a male in Cat Tien National Park.

Common Flameback*Dinopium javanense*

We saw a pair of this species in Cat Tien National Park.

Greater Flameback*Chrysocolaptes lucidus*

We heard the calls of this species in Cuc Phuong National Park and saw this woodpecker in Cat Tien National Park.

Pale-headed Woodpecker*Gecinulus grantia*

We saw one bird in bamboo forest of Cat Tien National Park.

Bay Woodpecker*Blythipicus pyrrhotis*

We had good views of a few birds in Tam Dao and Cuc Phuong National Parks. We also saw this woodpecker in Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.

Black and Buff Woodpecker*Meiglyptes jugularis*

We only heard the calls of this woodpecker in Cat Tien National Park.

Heart-spotted Woodpecker*Hemicircus canente*

We heard the calls of this small woodpecker in Cat Tien National Park.

Great Slaty Woodpecker*Mulleripicus pulverulentus*

We heard the calls of this woodpecker in Cat Tien National Park.

Broadbills Eurylaimidae**Black and Red Broadbill***Cymbirhynchus macrorhynchus*

We saw a few pairs of these beautiful broadbills in Cat Tien National Park.

Banded Broadbill*Eurylaimus javanicus*

We only heard the calls of this broadbill at Cat Tien National Park.

Dusky Broadbill*Corydon sumatranus*

We had scope views of four birds in Cat Tien National Park.

Silver-breasted Broadbill*Serilophus lunatus*

We heard the calls of this species in the forest of Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.

Pittas Pittidae**Eared Pitta***Pitta phayrei*

We heard the calls of this species in Cuc Phuong National Park.

Blue-rumped Pitta*Pitta soror*

We heard the calls of this pitta but we could not find them in Cuc Phuong National Park.

Bar-bellied Pitta*Pitta ellioti*

We all had good views of a male in the last morning of the trip in Cat Tien National Park.

Woodshrikes and allies Tephrodornithidae**Bar-winged Flycatcher-shrike***Hemipus picatus*

We saw a few birds in Tanung valley and in the forest of Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.

Woodswallows Artamidae**Ashy Woodswallow***Artamus fuscus*

We saw the first time at Tanung valley, Dalat and many more birds were seen at Cat Tien National Park.

Ioras Aegithinidae**Common Iora***Aegithina tiphia*

We saw this species first time at Cuc Phuong National Park and saw them again in Cat Tien National Park.

Great Iora*Aegithina lafresnayei*

We saw a few birds in Phan Thiet road, Di Linh and saw more birds in Cat Tien National Park.

Cuckooshrikes Campephagidae**Large Cuckooshrike***Coracina macei*

We saw a pair at Mt. Lang Giang, Da Lat.

Indochinese Cuckooshrike*Coracina polioptera*

We had great scope views of one in the forest of Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.

Black-winged Cuckooshrike *Coracina melaschistos*
 We saw this species first time at Cuc Phuong National Park and saw another time in Cat Tien National Park.

Swinhoe's (Brown-rumped) Minivet *Pericrocotus cantonensis*
 We saw a few birds in Cat Tien National Park.

Ashy Minivet *Pericrocotus divaricatus*
 We saw small flocks at Cat Tien National Park.

Grey-chinned Minivet *Pericrocotus solaris*
 We saw this minivet on Mt. Lang Biang, Da Lat.

Long-tailed Minivet *Pericrocotus ethologus*
 We saw this bird on Mt. Lang Biang and Tanung valley and at the Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.

Scarlet Minivet *Pericrocotus flammeus*
 The most common minivet of the trip. We had a great views at Cuc Phuong National Park, Tanung valley and at Cat Tien National Park.

Shrikes *Laniidae*

Brown Shrike *Lanius cristatus*
 We saw small numbers in Tam Dao National Park and saw a few birds in Dalat city. We also saw a few birds in Cat Tien National Park.

Burmese Shrike *Lanius colluriooides*
 We had scope views of this species around Dalat areas and Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.

Long-tailed Shrike *Lanius schach*
 We saw one bird in Cuc Phuong National Park.

Grey-backed Shrike *Lanius tephronotus*
 We had excellent scope views in Tam Dao National Park and saw another one in Cuc Phuong National Park.

Vireos, Greenlets *Vireonidae*

White-bellied Erpornis (Yuhina) *Erpornis zantholeuca*
 Our first sighting was stunning views of two birds in Tam Dao National Park and later we saw in Cuc Phuong National Park, Tanung valley and in the forest of Phan Thiet road.

Blyth's Shrike-Babbler (White-browed Shrike-Babbler) *Pteruthius aeralatus*
 We had great views of a pair on Tam Dao National Park and a few birds were seen on Mt. Lang Biang, Da Lat.

Clicking Shrike-babbler (Chestnut-fronted Shrike-Babbler) *Pteruthius intermedius*
 We had a quick view of a male and a female on Mt. Lang Biang, Da Lat.

Old World Orioles *Oriolidae*

Slender-billed Oriole *Oriolus tenuirostris*
 This bird is resident on hill forest in Dalat, we saw this species in the Pine forest near Ho Tuyen Lam and in the Pine forest at Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.

Black-naped Oriole *Oriolus chinensis*
 We had good looked of this species at Cuc Phuong National Park and saw more birds in Cat Tien National Park.

Black-hooded Oriole *Oriolus xanthornus*
 We had good views of several in Cat Tien National Park.

Maroon Oriole *Oriolus traillii*
 We had great views of this species in forest of Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.

Drongos *Dicruridae*

Black Drongo *Dicrurus macrocercus*
 We saw a few birds in open lowland habitats such as along the road and in the lowland open areas in Cat Tien National Park.

Ashy Drongo *Dicrurus leucophaeus*
 This is common species of Drongo often seen in the forest. We saw small numbers in various localities during our trip.

Bronzed Drongo *Dicrurus aeneus*
 We saw this small drongo in the forest of Phan Thiet road, Di Linh and they were quite common in Cat Tien National Park.

Lesser Racket-tailed Drongo *Dicrurus remifer*
 We saw this species in Tanung valley, Dalat.

Hair-crested Drongo *Dicrurus hottentottus*
 A small numbers were seen in Cuc Phuong National Park and a few were seen in forest of Phan Thiet road, Di Linh and also uncommon in Cat Tien National Park.

Greater Racket-tailed Drongo *Dicrurus paradiseus*
 First seen at Cuc Phuong National Park, with further sightings in Cat Tien National Park.

Fantails *Rhipiduridae*

We saw two birds in the forest of Cat Tien National Park.

Crows, Jays & Magpies *Corvidae*

Eurasian Jay

Garrulus glandarius

We saw this species very well on Mt. Lang Biang and at Ho Tuyen Lam, Dalat.

Red-billed Blue Magpie

Urocissa erythrorhyncha

Small flock was seen on Tam Dao National Park.

White-winged Magpie

Urocissa whiteheadi

A small flock was seen in Cuc Phuong National Park.

Common Green Magpie

Cissa chinensis

Three birds were seen in Tam Dao National Park.

Indochinese Green Magpie

Cissa hypoleuca

A pair was seen in the forest of Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.

Grey Treepie

Dendrocitta formosae

A pair was seen in Tam Dao National Park.

Racket-tailed Treepie

Crypsirina temia

We had seen three birds in Cuc Phuong National Park and a few birds were seen in Cat Tien National Park.

Ratchet-tailed Treepie

Temnurus temnurus

A pair was seen in Tam Dao National Park.

Fairy Flycatchers *Stenostiridae*

Grey-headed Canary-Flycatcher

Culicicapa ceylonensis

A few birds were seen in Tam Dao and Cuc Phuong National Parks. A few birds also seen Tanung valley, Dalat.

Chickadees & Tits *Paridae*

Japanese Tit

Parus minor

We found small numbers in pine forest in Tam Dao National Park, Cuc Phuong National Park and in Mt. Lang Biang, Dalat.

Green-backed Tit

Parus monticolus

A few birds were seen on Mt. Lang Biang and Tanung valley, Dalat.

Yellow-cheeked Tit

Parus spilonotus

Two birds were seen on Mt. Lang Biang, Dalat.

Sultan Tit

Melanochlora sultanea

We had scope views of a pair of this handsome species in Tam Dao and Cuc Phuong National Parks.

Bulbuls *Pycnonotidae*

Black-headed Bulbul

Pycnonotus atriceps

We saw this species at Cat Tien National Park.

Black-crested Bulbul

Pycnonotus melanicterus

A common bulbul in the forest, we saw them at all forest birding sites.

Red-whiskered Bulbul

Pycnonotus jocosus

We saw a few of them at Tam Dao and Cuc Phuong National Parks as well as in Tanung valley and at Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.

Light-vented Bulbul

Pycnonotus sinensis

A flock of 19 birds was seen near HQ of Cuc Phuong National Park.

Sooty-headed Bulbul

Pycnonotus aurigaster

We saw this species at Tam Dao and Cuc Phuong National Parks and also in Tanung valley and at Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.

Stripe-throated Bulbul

Pycnonotus finlaysoni

Small numbers were seen in Tam Dao and Cuc Phuong National Parks and quite common bulbul in Cat Tien National Park.

Flavescent Bulbul

Pycnonotus flavescens

Our first sighting was in Mt. Lang Biang and many more in Tanung valley and in the forest of Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.

Streak-eared Bulbul

Pycnonotus blanfordi

A few birds were seen around the accommodation and the open areas of Cat Tien National Park.

Puff-throated Bulbul*Criniger pallidus*

We saw this species in Tam Dao and Cucu Phuong National Parks and in the forest of Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.

Ochraceous Bulbul*Criniger ochraceus*

We saw this bird only in Cat Tien National Park.

Grey-eyed Bulbul*Iole propinqua*

Small numbers were seen in Cuc Phuong National Park, Tanung valley, Phan Thiet road and in Cat Tien National Park.

Mountain Bulbul*Ixos mccllellandii*

We saw a few birds on Mt. Lang Biang, Dalat.

Ashy Bulbul*Hemixos flavala*

We saw this bird very well in Mt. Lang Biang and in the forest of Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.

Chestnut Bulbul*Hemixos castanotus*

Two birds were seen feeding on fruiting tree in Tam Dao National Park.

Black Bulbul*Hypsipetes leucocephalus*

This species were quite common in Tam Dao National Park. We also saw them at Cuc Phuong National Park, Mt. Lang Biang, Thanung valley and at Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.

Swallows *Hirundinidae***Barn Swallow***Hirundo rustica*

Good numbers were seen in Dalat City, Phan Thiet road and in Cat Tien National Park.

Red-rumped Swallow*Cecropis daurica*

Good numbers were seen at Cuc Phuong National Park. A few birds were seen in Dalat City, Phan Thiet road and in Cat Tien National Park.

Cupwings *Pnoepygiae***Pygmy Cupwing (Pygmy Wren-Babbler)***Pnoepyga pusilla*

We had brief look of one on Mt. Lang Biang, Dalat.

Cettia bush Warblers & allies *Cettidae***Grey-bellied Tesia***Tesia cyaniventer*

We only heard the calls of this tesia on Mt. Lang Biang, Dalat.

Mountain Tailorbird*Phyllergates (Orthotomus) cucullatus*

We had good looked at one bird in Tam Dao National Park.

Brownish-flanked Bush-Warbler*Cettia fortipes*

One bird was seen in Tam Dao National Park.

Pale-footed Bush-Warbler*Cettia pallidipes*

We saw a few birds in Tam Dao National Park.

Long-tailed Tits *Aegithalidae***Grey-crowned Tit (Black-throated Tit)***Aegithalos annamensis*

This is a new endemic species in Vietnam. We saw this small bird on Mt. Lang Biang, Dalat.

Leaf Warblers & Allies *Phylloscopidae***Dusky Warbler***Phylloscopus fuscatus*

We saw one bird near small lake at the HQ of Tam Dao National Park.

Radde's Warbler*Phylloscopus schwarzi*

Our first sightings were in Tam Dao National Park then we saw another bird in Cuc Phuong National Park and also saw this species in Tanung valley, Dalat.

Yellow-browed Warbler*Phylloscopus inornatus*

Very common species found in all localities that we visited.

Two-barred Warbler*Phylloscopus plumbeitarsus*

We found a few birds at the lower part of Tam Dao, in Cuc Phuong National Park and in Cat Tien National Park.

Pale-legged Leaf Warbler*Phylloscopus tenellipes*

We saw this species in Cat Tien National Park.

Davison's Leaf Warbler*Phylloscopus davisoni*

Small numbers were seen in Tam Dao National Park, in Mt. Lang Biang and in Tanung valley, Dalat.

Limestone Leaf-Warbler*Phylloscopus calciatilis*

We saw this handsome yellow warbler seen near a prehistoric cave in Cuc Phuong National Park.

White-spectacled Warbler*Seicercus affinis*

A bird was seen in Mt. Lang Biang, Dalat.

Grey-cheeked Warbler*Seicercus poliogenys*

We only heard the calls of this bird on Mt. Lang Biang, Dalat.

Grey-crowned Warbler*Seicercus tephrocephalus*

A few birds were seen in Tam Dao and in Cuc Phuong National Parks.

Bianchi's Warbler *Seicercus omeiensis*

We had good views of one bird in Tam Dao National Park.

Plain-tailed Warbler *Seicercus soror*

A bird was seen in the forest of Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.

Chestnut-crowned Warbler *Seicercus castaniceps*

We had wonderful views of two birds on Mt. Lang Biang, Dalat.

Reed Warblers & Allies *Acrocephalidae*

Thick-billed Warbler *Iduna aedon*

We saw this species in Cat Tien National Park.

Grassbirds & Allies *Megaluridae*

Lanceolated Warbler *Locustella lanceolata*

We only heard the calls of this bird in Cuc Phuong National Park, in Tanung valley and heard in the grassland of Cat Tien National Park.

Russet Bush-Warbler *Bradypterus mandelli*

We saw this bird quite well in the small grassland in Cuc Phuong National Park.

Cisticolas & Allies *Cisticolidae*

Hill Prinia *Prinia supercilaris*

We saw a few birds in Tanung valley, Dalat.

Rufescent Prinia *Prinia rufescens*

We had good look at this bird in Tam Dao and in Cuc Phuong National Park.

Grey-breasted Prinia *Prinia hodgsonii*

We had good views of a few birds in the grassland of Cat Tien National Park.

Yellow-bellied Prinia *Prinia flaviventris*

We only heard the call of this species in tall grass at Cat Tien National Park.

Plain Prinia *Prinia inornata*

We saw a few birds in the grassland at Cat Tien National Park.

Common Tailorbird *Orthotomus sutorius*

Small numbers were seen in Tam Dao and Cuc Phuong National Park.

Dark-necked Tailorbird *Orthotomus atrogularis*

We had great views of several in Tam Dao National Park, at Phan Thiet road and in Cat Tien National Park.

Parrotbills, Old World Warblers *Sylviidae*

Black-crowned Parrotbill *Paradoxornis margaritae*

We saw few birds in the forest of Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.

Short-tailed Parrotbill *Paradoxornis davidianus*

We had good views of two birds on the "steps" walk in Tam Dao National Park.

Fuvettas and Ground Babblers *Pellorneidae*

Schaeffer's Fulvetta *Alcippe schaefferi*

This species was common bird in Tam Dao National Park.

Mountain Fulvetta *Alcippe peracensis*

Small numbers were seen on Mt.Lang Bian, Tanung valley and in the forest of Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.

Black-browed Fulvetta *Alcippe grotei*

We saw a few birds in Cuc Phuong National Park.

Rufous-throated Fulvetta *Alcippe rufogularis*

We found several small flocks of this bird in lower part of the forest in Cuc Phuong National Park.

Black-crowned Fulvetta *Pseudominla klossi*

We saw this endemic species up to five birds on Mt. Lang Biang, Dalat.

Buff-breasted Babbler *Pellorneum tickelli*

We saw this species in Cuc Phuong National Park.

Puff-throated Babbler *Pellorneum ruficeps*

We only heard the songs of this bird in Cuc Phuong and Cat Tien National Parks.

Spot-throated Babbler *Pellorneum albiventre*

Some of us saw this babbler on Mt. Lang Biang, Dalat.

Abbott's Babbler *Malacocincla abbotti*

We enjoyed great views of this bird in Cat Tien National Park.

Limestone Wren-Babbler *Napothera crispifrons*

We had a quick look on limestone cliffs at the way to the cave of prehistoric man in Cuc Phuong National Park .

Eye-browed Wren-Babbler *Napothera epilepidota*

We only heard the calls of this bird in Tam Dao National Park and in the forest of Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.

Laughingthrushes *Leiothrichidae*

- White-crested Laughingthrush** *Garrulax leucolophus*
Small numbers of this handsome species were seen in Cat Tien National Park.
- Grey Laughingthrush** *Garrulax maesi*
We in had good look of a few birds in Tam Dao National Park.
- Black-hooded Laughingthrush** *Garrulax milleti*
We saw three-four birds in the forest of Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.
- Black-throated Laughingthrush** *Dryonaster chinensis*
We heard the calls of this bird in Cuc Phuong National Park.
- White-cheeked Laughingthrush** *Dryonaster vassali*
We saw a large flock up to 20 birds in Tanung valley, Dalat.
- Orange-breasted Laughingthrush** *Stactocichla annamensis*
We had a quick look at this bird in the forest of Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.
- Blue-winged Siva** *Siva cyanouroptera*
We saw this species on Mt. Lang Biang, Dalat.
- Silver-eared Mesia** *Mesia argentauris*
We saw up to 10 birds in Tam Dao National Park.
- Rufous-backed Sibia** *Leioptila annectens*
We only heard the songs of this species in Tanung valley, Dalat.
- Black-headed Sibia** *Malacios desgodinsi*
We saw a few birds on Mt. Lang Biang and also saw in the forest of Phan Thiet roadi, Di Linh.
- Grey-crowned Crocias** *Crocias langbianis*
We had great views of two birds close to the road at Tanung valley, Dalat.
- Vietnamese Cutia** *Cutia legalleni*
We had good views of four birds on Mt. Lang Biang, Dalat.

Babblers & Allies *Timaliidae*

- Large Scimitar Babbler** *Pomatorhinus hypoleucos*
We only heard the calls of this bird in Tam Dao and also in Cuc Phuong National Parks.
- Streak-breasted Scimitar Babbler** *Pomatorhinus ruficollis*
We had good views of a pair in Tam Dao National Park.
- Orange-bellied Scimitar Babbler** *Pomatorhinus ochraceiceps*
We saw this species in the forest of Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.
- Coral-billed Scimitar Babbler** *Pomatorhinus ferruginosus*
We all had great views of this scimitar babbler in Tam Dao National Park.
- Rufous-capped Babbler** *Stachyris ruficeps*
We had good views of a pair on Mt. Lang Biang and in Tanung valley, Dalat.
- Golden Babbler** *Stachyris chrysaea*
We had good views of several birds in Tam Dao National Park.
- Grey-throated Babbler** *Stachyris nigriceps*
We had a good look at two birds in Tam Dao and in Cuc Phuang National Parks.
- Spot-necked Babbler** *Stachyris striolata*
We had quick views of this babbler in Tam Dao National Park.
- Pin-striped Tit Babbler (Striped Tit-Babbler)** *Macronous gularis*
First seen in Tam Dao National Park, with further sightings in Cuc Phuong National Park.
- Grey-faced Tit Babbler** *Macronous kelleyi*
We had great views of this near endemic species in Cat Tien National Park.
- Chestnut-capped Babbler** *Timalia pileata*
A few birds were seen in the open areas of Cat Tien National Park.
- Scaly-crowned Babbler** *Malacopteron cinereum*
We saw a few small flocks at Cat Tien National Park.

Yuhinas, White-eyes *Zosteropidae*

- Black-chinned Yuhina** *Yuhina nigrimenta*
We saw a small flock of this bird in Tam Dao National Park and in the forest of the Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.
- Japanese White-eye** *Zosterops japonicus*
Small numbers seen in Tam Dao National Park and also saw in the forest of Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.

Fairy-bluebirds *Irenidae*

Our first sighting was five birds at Phan Thiet road and a few more birds were seen at Cat Tien National Park.

Great Myna (White-vented Myna)

We saw both male and female taking a bath on a dirt road in Cat Tien National Park.

Oriental Magpie-Robin

Copsychus saularis

We saw this species in Cuc Phuong and in Cat Tien National Parks.

White-rumped Shama

Copsychus malabaricus

We had stunning views of several birds in Cat Tien National Park.

Spotted Forktail

Enicurus maculatus

We only heard the calls of this bird in Tam Dao National Park.

Eastern Stonechat

Saxicola maurus

First sighted in Tam Dao National Park and then in Cat Tien National Park.

Pied Bush Chat

Saxicola caprata

We saw a few birds in open areas of Cat Tien National Park.

Grey Bush Chat

Saxicola ferreus

A few birds were seen in Tam Dao National Park. We also saw them on Mt. Lang Biang and in Ho Tuyen Lam, Dalat.

Blue Rock Thrush

 We had seen small numbers in Phan Thiet road, Di Linh and in Cat Tien National Park.

Golden-fronted Leafbird *Chloropsis aurifrons*
 We saw a few birds in Cat Tien National Park.

Orange-bellied Leafbird *Chloropsis hardwickii*
 A pair was seen very well in Tam Dao National Park.

 We had great sightings of several in Tam Dao National Park and another bird on Mt. Lang Biang, Dalat.

Scarlet-backed Flowerpecker *Dicaeum cruentatum*
 Small numbers were seen in Cuc Phuong and in Cat Tien National Park.

Sunbirds & Spiderhunters *Nectariniidae*

Brown-throated Sunbird *Anthreptes malacensis*
 A pair was seen very well in Cat Tien National Park.

Van Hasselt's Sunbird *Leptocoma brasiliana*
 We had very good views of male this sunbird in Cat Tien National Park.

Purple Sunbird *Cinnyris asiaticus*
 We had great views of this species in Cat Tien National Park.

Olive-backed Sunbird *Cinnyris jugularis*
 Commonly seen near the accommodation and in open forest in Cat Tien National Park.

Mrs. Gould's Sunbird *Aethopyga gouldiae*
 This stunner sunbird was seen very well on Mt. Lang Biang and in Tanung valley, Dalat.

Fork-tailed Sunbird *Aethopyga christinae*
 We had seen several stunning males in Tam Dao and Cuc Phuong National Parks.

Black-throated Sunbird *Aethopyga saturata*
 This species was commonly seen in Tanung valley and in forest of Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.

Crimson Sunbird *Aethopyga siparaja*
 This stunning species was seen very well in Tam Dao, Cuc Phuong and Cat Tien National Parks.

Purple-naped Sunbird *Hypogramma hypogrammicum*
 We had good views of one bird in Cat Tien National Park.

Little Spiderhunter *Arachnothera longirostra*
 We had great sightings of this sunbird in Phan Thiet road and in Cat Tien National Park.

Streaked Spiderhunter *Arachnothera magna*
 We saw this spiderhunter for the first time in Tam Dao National Park. Many birds also were seen in Cuc Phuong National Park, Mt. Lang Biang and Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.

Buntings & allies *Emberizidae*

Chestnut Bunting

Emberiza rutila

One adult male was seen along the trail in Tam Dao National Park.

Northern Treeshrew *Tupaia belageri*

We heard the calls of this small mammal in Cat Tien National Park.

Northern Smooth-tailed Treeshrew *Dendrogale murina*

We only hear the calls of this mammal in Cat Tien National Park.

Monkeys *Cercopithecidae*

Black-shanked Douc Langur *Pygathrix nigripes*

We had great view of a few of these langurs at Cat Tien National Park.

Long-tailed Macaque *Macaca fascicularis*

There were many of these monkeys live along the Dong Nai River, Cat Tien National Park.

Gibbons *Hylobatidae*

Buff-cheeked Gibbon *Hylobates gabriellae*

We heard the calls of this gibbon in the forest at Cat Tien National Park.

Squirrels *Sciuridae*

Black Giant Squirrel *Ratufa bicolor*

We heard the calls of this squirrel at Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.

Burmese Striped Squirrel *Tamiops mccllellandi*

Small numbers were seen in Cuc Phuong National Park, Tanung valley and Phan Thiet road, Di Linh.

Pallas's Squirrel *Callosciurus erythraeus*

We had seen a few of this squirrel in Cat Tien National Park.

Red-cheeked Ground Squirrel *Dremomys rufigenis*

We saw a few in Tam Dao National Park and saw another one on Mt. Lang Biang, Dalat.

Mongoose *Herpestidae*

Small Asian Mongoose *Herpestes javanicus*

One was seen along the road in Cat Tien National Park.

Deer *Cervidae*

Common Muntjac *Muntiacus muntjak*

One was seen along the road in Cat Tien National Park.
